Read the <u>first eight paragraphs from Federalist Paper #84</u> [http://www.yale.edu/lawweb/avalon/federal/fed84.htm] by Alexander Hamilton, paying particular attention to paragraph four, in which Hamilton cites the provisions included in the body of the Constitution that guarantee individual rights to due process of law. List those provisions and similar ones in the Magna Carta and the Bill of Rights (Amendments 1-10 of the Constitution).
