Delivery (1X - 4)	Delivery is flawless. There are no breaks in presentation or empty spaces of time. Comments/Examples:	Delivery is very good with a few difficulties. There is one or two breaks or empty spaces.	Delivery has more than two breaks or empty spaces.	Delivery is exemplified by more breaks and empty spaces than by any continuity.

Examples of Creativity:

- 1. Participants take the role of historical personalities debating the topic (i.e., William Jennings Bryan and William Randolph Hearst debating U.S. expansionism).
- 2. A rare or interesting analogy is utilized (i.e., multiple comparisons to like events before or after the topic San Juan Hill and Bay of Pigs).
- 3. The topic of debate is connected to a great theme or topic of United States History (i.e., connecting U.S. occupation of the Philippines to racism in U.S. foreign policy).
- 4. Consistently debating the topic in the terms, verb tense, and emotion of the time period.
