### **PRIMARY SOURCE**

- Original, unaltered records
- First-hand records from someone who witnessed an event take place
- Examples include:
  - Photos
  - Audio Interviews
  - Databases of names
  - Maps
  - Letters
  - Newspapers\* (written on or near the date that the event happened)

#### **SECONDARY SOURCE**

- Sources that analyze or summarize events or records and usually give an opinion
- Examples include:
  - Biographies
  - Textbooks
  - Journal articles
  - Newspapers\* (written well after the event, like an anniversary article)

### **COUNTRY MARKS**

Country marks were used within African Tribes. When people were taken into the Slave Trade, the descriptions were used to find runaways.



# LORD DUNMORE

 Lord Dunmore was the British Governor of New York and Virginia. He worked to defeat the American Revolutionaries and wrote the Dunmore Proclamation.

# MOUNT VERNON

- The estate and home of the first President, George Washington.
- Washington had at least 577 enslaved people on record over the course of his life at Mount Vernon.

 A list of escaped slaves and free Black folk who joined the British army during the American Revolution.
